### CHESTERBROOK ACADEMY

Issue: Mounting heights and reach ranges in children's toilet facilities.

Analysis: The applicant is requesting a waiver from constructing toilet facilities for children in a day care center in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 11. The project is a new, one story 10,900 square foot building costing \$2,500,000. Toilets for staff and the public have been designed according to Chapter 11; however, all facilities for children comply with the ADA Accessibility Guidelines for Building Element Design for Children's Use.

### **Project Progress:**

The project is under design and in plan review. .

#### Items to be Waived:

Mounting heights and reach ranges for children, as specified in Section 11-4.1.3(11).

11-4-1.3(11) If toilet rooms are provided, then each public and common use toilet room shall comply with Section 11-4.22.

Waiver Criteria: There is no specific guidance for a waiver of this requirement in the code. The Commission's current rule, authorized in Section 553.512, Florida Statutes, provides criteria for granting waivers and allows consideration of unnecessary or extreme hardship to the applicant if the specific requirements were imposed.



### Onestion:

Is it the intent of 11-4.1.3(11) to allow a toilet room in an individual class room of a Daycare Occupancy to be "adaptable" only? The plumbing fixture count has been met. Their are additional toiler rooms [in] each class room. The toilet rooms are provided for occupants of a specific space (i.e.,3-year old classroom, 4-year old classroom, etc.)however they are not the occupant of a private office as given in the example of the code.

### Answer:

No. Section 11-4.1.3(11) states: "if toilet rooms are provided, then each public and common use toilet room shall comply with 11-4.22." As classroom toilet rooms are for "common use," they shall comply with 11-4.22 and can not be just adaptable.

### Commentary:

Many such childcare and school classroom facilities have been granted variances by the Florida Building Commission to allow them to use the dimensional requirements of the Access Board's Recommendations for Children's Facilities.

The Building Officials Association of Florida, in cooperation with the Florida Building Commission, the Florida Department of Community Affairs, HCC, and industry and professional experts offer this interpretation of the Florida Building Code in the interest of consistency in their application statewide. This interpretation is informal, non-binding and subject to acceptance and approval by the local building official.
