If it takes them sending a copy of documents to every media outlet and using the internet in order to inform other homeowners in the State they may have this product on their wall, so be it, they have a right to get the answers they seek.

As always, I am available at 941-815-6019. Please take the focus away from me and help the homeowners. I revealed the results in court October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012. Regardless of the outcome in trial in January, this will never be finished until the homeowners receive some justice.
