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Welcome:

Mr. Blair opened the meeting at 2:00 p.m., Friday, January 26, 2018 and provided the teleconference participation process.

Acting Chairman Schock welcomed the Commissioners, staff and members of the public to the call and advised the purpose of the meeting was to receive an update on relevant Legislative actions, legal issues and to consider approval of the Energy Code Compliance Software for the 6th Edition (2017) Florida Building Code, Energy Conservation. He then asked Mr. Blair to perform roll call.

Mr. Blair called roll and a quorum was determined with 17 members present on the call.

Agenda:

Mr. Blair provided an overview of the agenda for today's teleconference call.

Acting Chairman Schock asked for a motion to approve the agenda as posted.

A motion was entered by Commissioner Boyer to approve the agenda as posted. Commissioner Schilling seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with a vote of 17 to 0.

Chairman's Discussion/Issues:

Acting Chairman Schock advised that he was appointing Brian Swope to the Lightning Protection Workgroup.

Legislative Update and Bill Matrix: (ATTACHMENT A)

Mr. Campbell advised that the matrix was attached to the agenda providing the current status of all of the bills that could affect the Commission. He stated that HB 299 reducing the size of the Commission is in the same status and is waiting to be heard. Mr. Campbell stated there is no companion for this bill. In addition Mr. Campbell advised that he had added SB 908 and HB 723 which does not directly impact the Commission but does have impact on contractors and he felt the bills could be of interest for the members. Legal Report:

Justin Vogel, Esq. provided an update to the Commission on the status of the rule challenge reporting that both parties submitted recommended orders to the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH) on January 18, 2018, and it is anticipated that the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) will issue the final order in mid-February. He also indicated that he would brief the Commission on what the impacts to the development of the 7th Edition (2020) Florida Building Code would be relative to both parties' when orders are received.

Commissioner Hamberger joined the call. The record reflects a total of 18 members were currently on the call.

<u>To Consider Approval of Energy Code Compliance Software for the 6th Edition (2017)</u> <u>Florida Building Code, Energy Conservation:</u>

Acting Chairman Schock stated that periodically the Commission is requested to consider approval of Energy Code Compliance Software for specific editions of the Florida Building Code, Energy Conservation.

Acting Chairman Shock advised that the Commission is now being asked to consider approving Energy Code Compliance Software for the 6th Edition (2017) Florida Building Code, Energy Conservation, specifically REScheck version 4.6.5.0 Florida for demonstrating compliance with residential building energy requirements.

Acting Chairman Schock stated that Commissioner Smith will provide the Energy TAC's recommendation and Mr. Madani will provide any technical background needed and answer members' questions.

Commissioner Smith stated that the Energy TAC met on January 19, 2018 and reviewed the REScheck software for demonstrating compliance with residential building energy requirements and is recommending conditional approval with the condition that the vendor correct the program consistent with DBPR staff's comments.

Acting Chairman Schock asked for a motion to conditionally approve Energy Code Compliance Software for the 6th Edition (2017) Florida Building Code, Energy Conservation, specifically REScheck version 4.6.5.0 Florida for demonstrating compliance with residential building energy requirements.
