#### **Roll Call:**

Ms. Peters performed roll call for the Electrical TAC. A quorum was determined with 8 members present.

#### **Agenda Approval:**

Mr. Burdick entered a motion to approve the agenda for today's meeting as posted. Mr. Tibbs seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with a vote of 8 to 0.

#### **Approval of Minutes from January 24, 2017:**

Mr. Tibbs entered a motion to approve the minutes from January 24, 2017 as posted. Mr. Gerwig seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with a vote of 8 to 0.

To review and accept final draft report for research project titled "Evaluation of the Cost Impact of Florida's Specific Changes to 2015 I-Code Changes (Prescriptive Code Changes)":

Mr. Madani provided background of this report and that it was researched to determine the cost impact on Florida Specific changes.

Dr. Raymond Issa provided detail of the report with a power point presentation. He began with the Pool Code cost changes and then provided Electrical Code costs changes.

Mr. Flanagan entered a motion to approve the report. Mr. Tibbs seconded the motion.

#### **Electrical and Swimming Pool TAC Comments:**

Corky Williams inquired how the \$150.00 figure for the GFCI was obtained.

Dr. Issa advised the figures were obtained from electrical contractors.

Dr. Issa stated that the report has been updated to reflect actual figures.

Mr. Clarkson also inquired potential bonding costs.

Mr. Clarkson asked if the service was visual only or visual and testing.

Mr. Madani stated that this was based on visual.

Mr. Clarkson asked if this could be included in the report.

Kevin Flanagan stated that he would like to see visual inspection to the report.

Mr. Flanagan then called for the Electrical TAC vote.

The vote passed unanimously with a vote of 8 to 0.

#### **Additional TAC Comments:**

David Rice questioned the Florida Building Code Residential discussion at the last meeting and changes to Chapter 34 through 43.

Mr. Madani explained how the Florida Specific changes began and how they are completed today. He further advised that he would be glad to go through the entire process with Mr. Rice at his convenience via telephone.

April Hammonds, Esq. explained that all provisions sunset and previously they had been reserved so the International Code is the base code so if someone wanted to submit a recommendation that any area be reserved they could but that has not been done. She further stated unless someone makes that recommendation there will be no change.

Mr. Madani advised of how the reviews are completed and that all information is present on the BCIS.

Mr. Rice stated no one has submitted any changes or comments.

The comment deadlines were given.

Mr. Madani stated he would be glad to discuss timelines for comments and the glitch process with him via a phone call.
