SUBJECT:

Baptismal Pools

INFORMATION ONLY

We have received some questions involving the regulation of church and synagogue baptismal pools. We have reviewed the statute along with our legal council, Amy Jones, and we agree that Chapter 514, F.S., does not cover these structures.

Public swimming pools and public pools are defined in Chapter 514, F.S., paragraph (2) as, "a watertight structure of concrete, masonry, or other approved materials which is located either indoors or outdoors, used for bathing or swimming by humans". Baptismal pools are not used for bathing or swimming and, therefore, are not to be regulated under Chapter 514, F.S. This does not mean that swimming pools at churches used for both swimming and baptismal practices are exempted from regulation. Only structures that are used strictly for baptismal or similar functions are exempt.
