



*Mularkey Brothers Dry Goods opened in 1897 at 210 Centre Street with a wide variety of goods. The building had formally been the Mode Brothers store making the initials MB, engraved on the metal columns at each end of the store, appropriate for both owners. At the left was The Grand movie theater that is today Harbor Ware Clothiers. The second story was removed after a 1920's fire and is today The Ship's Lantern. Photo circa 1915.*

*An excellent view from the roof of the Egmont Hotel at South Seventh and Beech Streets looking east toward the beach. Visible along Beech Street is the railroad track to the beach and Strathmore Hotel; in the foreground the long rooftop of the community bowling alley, a sport which became popular in this country in the mid-1800's, and the Bell House in the center that had been known as the "C" House. For the past 10 years the house has been the Beech Street Grill. Right center is the Macedonia AME Church on South Eighth Street and left center is the city utility works at the smoke stack.
