Hi,

Here is the estimated cost of a Genesis vertical lift. Without seeing the site, I had to make some assumptions, i.e. is there enough room to get the lift into place without going to a 2 piece (and added expense) tower. Florida building and elevator code required that any lift over 60" be in an enclosure. \$ 23,616.00

- Model GVL-EN-96 max lifting height 8'3" lead screw drive 750lb capacity
- 2. Aluminum frame enclosure with clear Plexiglas enclosure
- 3. Courtesy lights on the car operating panel
- Frame mounted rocker style control switches
- 5. Mechanical interlocks
- 6. Standard (36" x 48") platform straight thru enter/ exit with handrail
- 7. 42" wide door at bottom landing
- 8. 42" wide gate at upper landing
- 9. Anchors, shims and tower braces
- 10. Freight
- 11. Permit and inspection
- 12. Labor and installation

Electric and site prep by others. Electric is 115 VAC on a 20 amp dedicated circuit in a fused lockable box with blade arm disconnect located within sight of the lift. Lighting required is 10 candle power at each entrance and over the platform with a 4 hour emergency light over the platform. If the building is sprinkled, no head over the platform without a shunt trip. The disconnect box must be marked with the panel and breaker number that feeds the lift.

Lead time is 4-6 weeks once the signed drawings and deposit is received. Freight (truck) is 7 to 10 days depending on weather and installation averages 5 working days.

The upper landing gate will require additional side support (by others) to ensure proper stability and safety. Since this is a flat floor application, a ramp (3" tall) is included and an electric door opener is required.

A deposit of \$ 16,000 will be required with the balance due upon completion and successful inspection. The state monitor requires a 5 day lead time to schedule his initial inspection.

Annual Maintenance and inspection is required to comply with the Bureau of elevator safety. We provide annual maintenance at a cost of \$ 250 and he notify the state inspector so he may schedule the inspection. We use JEIS (Jacksonville Elevator Inspection Service)

Liability Insurance and Workers Comp. certificates will be provided.

Please call with any questions. If your client wished to proceed, I really need to see the site to ensure the lift will meet his needs and fit where the client would like it.
