

The following acts shall constitute grounds for revocation of accreditor approval:

- a) Knowingly making a recommendation for course accreditation that does not comply with the Florida Building Code.
- b) Intentionally violating any rule adopted by the commission relating to the accreditation process.
- c) Entering into misleading, deceptive, or fraudulent agreements with providers for the purpose of financial gain of the accreditor or a third party.
- d) Entering into misleading, deceptive, or fraudulent agreements with other accreditors for the purpose of financial gain of the accreditors or a third party.
- e) Delegating the performance of accreditor responsibilities to another individual or entity.

OR

Delegating the performance of accreditor responsibilities by a person when the accreditor delegating or contracting for the performance of such responsibilities knows, or has reason to know, such person is not qualified by training, experience, and authorization to perform such duties

If the accreditor status is revoked by the commission, the accreditor cannot reapply for two years from the date of the Final Order revoking the accreditor approval.
