### THE PALMS HOTEL AND SPA

Issue: Vertical accessibility to the front entrance of a historic building.

Analysis: The applicant is requesting a waiver from providing an accessible front entrance of a hotel undergoing alteration work to its guest rooms and suites. The front entrance is located seven steps above a sloped driveway without a parallel sidewalk. The building's owners have provided an additional pedestrian entrance at the side of the building, for use by the general public as well as persons with disabilities. This was done so that a safer alternative away from vehicular traffic. The structure is a qualified historic building and making changes to the main entrance would substantially damage the historic character of the hotel.

## **Project Progress:**

The project is in plan review.

### Items to be Waived:

Vertical accessibility to the front entrance, as required by Chapter 553.509, Florida Statutes.

- 553.509 Vertical accessibility. Nothing in Sections 553.501-553.513 or the guidelines shall be construed to relieve the owner of any building, structure or facility governed by those sections from the duty to provide vertical accessibility to all levels above and below the occupiable grade level regardless of whether the guidelines require an elevator to be installed in such building, structure or facility, except for:
  - (1) Elevator pits, elevator penthouses, mechanical rooms, piping or equipment catwalks and automobile lubrication and maintenance pits and platforms;
  - (2) Unoccupiable spaces, such as rooms, enclosed spaces and storage spaces that are not designed for human occupancy, for public accommodations or for work areas; and
  - (3) Occupiable spaces and rooms that are not open to the public and that house no more than five persons, including, but not limited to equipment control rooms and projection booths.

Waiver Criteria: There is no specific guidance for a waiver of this requirement in the code. The Commission's current rule, authorized in Section 553.512, Florida Statutes, provides criteria for granting waivers and allows consideration of unnecessary or extreme hardship to the applicant if the specific requirements were imposed.

In addition, the main entrance of the building is a vehicular entrance and creates difficulties for pedestrians (both with, and without disabilities) to safely go from the sidewalk to the entrance. As such, the Palm's owners have included creating a separate pedestrian entrance from Collins Avenue into the building for both disabled and non-disabled patrons and guests.

The Palms Hotel and Spa is a historic building on Miami Beach that is undergoing alterations to update its guest rooms/suites. At the same time, because of Ownership's concerns regarding patrons having to traverse a frequently congested sloped driveway, the project is being revised to include a pedestrian entrance into the building from the southwest corner of 30<sup>th</sup> Street and Collins Avenue.

There are significant difficulties in providing vertical accessibility from the public (Collins Avenue) sidewalk due to the slope of the driveway, which does not have a parallel sidewalk. Then, at the top of the driveway there is an entrance stair with 7 risers. At the top of the driveway to the north side of the steps, there is an existing wheelchair lift to provide vertical accessibility for guests and patrons with disabilities who arrive by cars and other vehicles. Unfortunately, even if it were possible to provide an accessible route to the top of the driveway from the public sidewalk without significantly and adversely affecting the historic character of the front of the Palms, such a path would have to come from the south requiring pedestrians (with and/or without disabilities) to cross over the top of the driveway through loading and unloading vehicles to get to the lift at the north side.

Because we will be providing the new pedestrian entrance, we are unsure of whether a waiver is even required. However, since the building department has requested we attain one (although the Planning and Historic Preservation department staff has seen information on the proposed pedestrian entrance, the building department has not yet seen it as of the date of this application), we are applying for the waiver.


