Course Description

1) Content

- i) Updates pool and spas professionals on the following:
 - o Pool/spa energy efficiency requirements as it relates to new and existing pool construction and renovations. Provides guidance on how to incorporate energy requirements with APSP-5 and APSP-7. It will discuss the guidelines regarding energy efficiency for pool heaters, residential filtration pumps and motors and portable spas per legislative directive.
 - o Summarizes Residential & Building (public) Code pool and spa provisions & changes.
 - o Summarizes the federal and state ADA regulations for new and existing commercial swimming facilities.
 - o Summarizes a miscellaneous Florida code provision applicable to pools and spas.

3) Overall Goal of the Course

- i) Help pool contractors understand energy efficiency requirements – clarify compliance and changes to how it applies to existing swimming pools and spas.
 - o Help the pool and spa business owner identify equipment which falls under these guidelines.
 - o Discuss the requirements for pump motors, plumbing designs (hydraulics), heating appliances, spa equipment as set forth under the code.
- ii) Summarize the federal and state ADA regulations for contractors who work on commercial pools and spas.
- iii) Provide an overview of other provisions in the Residential & Building codebooks applicable to pools and spas. Clarifies that no more existing building code requirements exist in the 5th edition.

- i) Identify regulatory requirements for energy efficiency for residential & commercial in-ground swimming pools/spas and portable spas.
- ii) Create an understanding of the code and the pool professional's responsibility to provide products which comply and meet energy efficient standards.
