SOUTHERN MANATEE FIRE & RESCUE STATION #3

Issue: Accessibility in toilet facilities used exclusively by firefighters.

Analysis: The applicant is requesting a waiver from providing accessible toilets in the portion of a new fire station that is occupied exclusively by firefighters. The project is a one story 7,601 square foot building that costs \$1,600,000 and will replace an existing facility that is no longer usable for this purpose. According to the applicant, all firefighter personnel must be physically able in accordance with Sections 633-30-633.35, F. S. and NFPA Standard 1582. Areas open to the public are fully accessible, including toilet rooms.

Project Progress:

The project is in plan review.

Items to be Waived:

Accessible toilets, as required by Section 11-4.1.2(6).

11-4.1.2(6) If toilet facilities are provided on a site, then each such public or common use toilet facility shall comply with Section 11-4.22.

Waiver Criteria: There is no specific guidance for a waiver of this requirement in the code. The Commission's current rule, authorized in Section 553.512, Florida Statutes, provides criteria for granting waivers and allows consideration of unnecessary or extreme hardship to the applicant if the specific requirements were imposed.

The hardship is a result of a condition that is not accounted for under the code. A Fire Station is a facility used mainly to house firefighting equipment and firefighters. The minimum requirements to qualify as Florida Statutes 633.30 – 633.35, govern a firefighter. Under these sections there is a requirement that a firefighter be in good physical condition as outlined by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standard 1582. Not under any circumstances would an individual with a disability be qualified to be a firefighter. Therefore, making the requirement of the accessibility code impractical for those areas of the Fire Station that would not be open to the public.

The following comments pertain to New Fire Station #3, 7611 Prospect Road, in particular bathrooms 104, 105, and 115. Doors 101b and 117a separate firefighter areas from public spaces. As per Federal Register 28 CFR Part 35 Section 35.151 and 36 CFR Part 1191, the Department of Justice's Title II Regulations give State and Local Governments the option of choosing between designing, constructing, or altering their facilities in conformance with UFAS or with ADAAG. We choose to use UFAS which includes Occupancy Classification Section that is not included in the ADA. This Section 4.1.4 (5) deals with Fire Stations and states that the application of the code should apply to: "All Areas for Which the Intended Use will require Public Access or Which May Result in Employment of Physically Handicapped Persons." Based on this we contend that the bathrooms for the firefighters do not need to comply with the accessibility requirement.

Please note that we are providing an accessible toilet room in the front part of the Fire Station where the public will have access.

I'm not an attorney, but I'm unaware of any provision of law that would permit the building official to take such action. The only similar situation would be if an applicant had previously received a waiver and planned to **exactly** replicate a project in a different location. If that occurs, the application is submitted and staff verifies that the conditions are identical; the project then goes on a consent agenda for ratification by the Commission, but the process must still be followed. MK

Dear Garry:

East Manatee Fire Rescue requires persons seeking employment as a Firefighter to submit to and then successfully pass a vigorous physical and medical evaluation that is in accordance with Florida Statute 633.34, Firefighters Qualification for Employment and Florida Administrative Code 69A-37.037, Firefighter Training Course Medical Examination. These laws require a firefighter candidate to be in "good physical condition" in order to obtain certification in the State of Florida. As outlined on the State of Florida's Bureau of Fire Standards and Training's Medical Evaluation form (DI4-1022), firefighter candidates must not only submit to the standard hearing, vision, and cardiac assessments, but the examining physician must attest to the candidates ability to on the following criteria from the National Fire Protection Association Standard 1582 - Comprehensive Occupational Medical Program for Fire Departments (NFPA 1582):

- 1. Wear personal protective equipment that weighs approximately 50 pounds while performing firefighting tasks which would include the lifting, carrying and raising of heavy ground ladders; using heavy equipment and tools to perform forcible entry or vehicle extrication; working with heavy hose lines that have considerable nozzle reaction.
- 2. Perform the tasks described in item #1 and other physically demanding work while wearing positive pressure breathing equipment with 1.5 inches of water column resistance to exhalation at a flow of 40 liters per minute.
- 3. Work for long periods of time requiring sustained physical activity and intense concentration.

- 4. Make rapid transitions from rest to near maximal exertion without warm-up periods.
- 5. Tolerate extreme fluctuations in temperature while performing duties. Must perform physically demanding work in hot (400 degree F) humid (100%) atmospheres while wearing equipment that significantly impairs body-cooling mechanisms.
- 6. Perform a variety of tasks on slippery, hazardous surfaces such as rooftops or from ladders.
- 7. Rely on the senses of sight, hearing, smell, and touch to help determine the nature of the emergency, maintain personal safety, and make critical decisions in a confused, chaotic, and potentially life-threatening environment throughout the duration of the operation.

After employment, Firefighters with East Manatee Fire Rescue are required to continue to meet the criteria of NFPA 1582 throughout their career. Any injury or illness that is addressed by a physician is evaluated based on NFPA 1582. Prior to allowing an individual to return to full duty, the examining physician must attest that the physical condition of the Firefighter meets the criteria of Standard 1582.

Firefighters who have become injured are not allowed to work at a fire station or permitted to work on the emergency apparatus until they are deemed fit for duty by a physician.


All civilian and non-firefighting staff are assigned to Fire District Headquarters.


SMFD Fire Station 3



TAGS & NOTES FLOOR PLAN











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
SMFD Fire Station 3 Enlarged Plans, Int. Elevations















