Dear Mr. Modani,

My name is Geoff McLeod of MESA Modular Systems, Inc. My Partner and I have designed and engineered a product for the HVAC industry and are currently contacting counties and municipalities to make sure they will accept the MESA product prior to marketing it in their jurisdiction.

Our modular system is designed to withstand 150mph wind loads while allowing it to be elevated to levels of 8", 16" or 24". Our engineering meets the requirements of the Florida Building Code 2007 and 2009 supplements, and the Wind -Borne Debris Regions, Category "C". Our modular system is a designed as a "one size fits all" product for ground level, residential, AC condensing units. The MESA system is intended to meet the needs of AC contractors who are faced with high wind requirements, coastal flooding, local flash flooding or unusually moist ground conditions, or any of the above combinations.

I would like to ask if it would be possible to issue a Declaratory Statement that would position our system as an "other approved material" per the Residential Code Section M 1305.1.4.1 and the Mechanical Code 304.9.
