FRSA's Codes Sub-Committee met yesterday and voted to request that ADM94-16 be removed from the consent agenda at the Florida Building Commission meeting being held on October 8th and 9th 2018.

FRSA is very concerned about several of the provisions in the new ASCE 7-16 standard that is included in the proposed modification. The wind pressures outlined will have a significant negative impact on Florida's roofing contractors, roofing material manufacturers and consumers. They will cause major increases in the cost of roofing for both new construction and reroofing. The cost impact of this standard will be significant and have not had any vetting to date.

This new standard is in FRSA's opinion is not warranted based on observations of construction meeting the current code provisions after hurricane Irma.
