Joe,

Sections 4402.3 and 4403.1 were the sections that allowed the use of windbreakers in South Florida. These sections were somehow left out or overlooked when establishing the HVHZ sections in the FBC. It would make perfect sense to put these in under the glitch cycle. The sections read as follows:

4402.3 POSTING:

Structures designed to be readily removed or repositioned during periods of high wind velocity shall be posted with a legible and readily visible decal or painted instructions to the owner or tenant to remove or reposition the structure or part thereof during such periods of time as are designated by the U.S. Weather Bureau as being a hurricane warning or alert.

4403.1 LOADS:

(a) Rigid awnings, canopies, canopy shutters and screened enclosures shall be designed to resist the loads set forth in Chapter 23 of this Code except that structures or parts thereof which are intended to be removed or repositioned during periods of high wind velocity shall be designed in their open or extended position to resist velocity pressures not less than that based on 75 MPH wind with applicable shape factors and to resist not less than 15 psf roof live load.
