OVERVIEW OF WORKGROUP'S KEY ACTIONS AND DECISIONS

THURSDAY, JANUARY 18, 2018

I. MEETING SUMMARY AND OVERVIEW

At the January 18, 2018 Teleconference meeting the Workgroup received an overview and briefing on the Workgroup's scope, purpose, and project workplan; a review of the Commission's decision-making procedures and polices including applicability of the Sunshine Law; and, received a briefing regarding project relevant background information (linked to the meeting agenda on the BCIS).

Workgroup members agreed to send their proposed options regarding lightning protection standards for the Florida Building Code to Jeff Blair, Commission Facilitator, by close of business on Thursday, January 25, 2018 for incorporation into an options evaluation worksheet. Members of the public were also invited to send specific options for evaluation. The Workgroup will evaluate all submitted options at their next meeting on February 12, 2018. Options should be sent to Jeff Blair in a word document format at: jblair@fsu.edu. Finally, members were requested to send any presentations they wish to make to the Workgroup to DBPR staff by Friday, February 2, 2018. The options worksheet and presentations will by linked to the meeting agenda posted to the BCIS.

III. AGENDA REVIEW AND APPROVAL

The Workgroup voted unanimously, 16 - 0 in favor, to approve the agenda for the January 18, 2018 meeting as presented/posted. Following are the key agenda items approved for consideration:

IV. WORKGROUP SCOPE, PURPOSE AND PROJECT WORKPLAN

Mo Madani reviewed the Workgroup scope and purpose and Project Workplan. The scope and purpose of the Workgroup is to build consensus on a recommendation to the Florida Building Commission regarding whether lightning protection requirements should be included in the future update to the Florida Building Code; and if yes, to provide recommended code change language that takes into consideration available lightning protection standards and technologies. The project Workplan is included as *Attachment 3* of this report.

V. REVIEW OF PROCEDURAL ISSUES

Jeff Blair briefly reviewed the Workgroup's decision-making and procedural polices and procedures noting they are the same as the Commission's, including the applicability of the Sunshine Law, and answered member's questions. Jeff noted that the Commission's workgroups and committees function using a consensus based decision-making process. General consensus is a participatory process whereby, on matters of substance, the members strive for agreements which all of the members can accept, support, live with or agree not to oppose. In instances where, after vigorously exploring possible ways to enhance the members' support for the final decision on a recommendation, and the Workgroup finds that 100% acceptance or support is not achievable, final decisions will require at least 75% favorable vote of all members present and voting. This super majority decision rule underscores the importance of actively developing consensus throughout the process on substantive issues with the participation of all members and which all can live with. In instances where the Workgroup finds that even 75% acceptance or support is not achievable, publication of recommendations will include documentation of the differences and the options that were considered for which there is more than 50% support from the Workgroup. Jeff noted that a more detailed review would be provided at the next meeting.

Sunshine Law Requirements Applicability to Workgroup Members

Jeff also explained that Workgroup members are subject to the requirements of Florida's Government in the Sunshine Law, commonly referred to as the Sunshine Law (Section 286.011 F.S.), and may not discuss with each other, outside of properly noticed meetings, issues that may foreseeably come before the Workgroup for discussion.

VI. OVERVIEW OF BACKGROUND AND REFERENCE MATERIALS AND IDENTIFICATION OF ANY NEEDED ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

VIII. NEXT WORKGROUP MEETING OVERVIEW AND ISSUES

The next Workgroup meeting is scheduled for February 12, 2018 in Jacksonville and will start at 9:00 AM. The meeting will focus on member informational presentations (submittal deadline of Friday, February 2, 2018) and the evaluation of options submitted regarding proposed Lightning Protection standards for the Florida Building Code. Options for consideration should be submitted by members/stakeholders to Jeff Blair by COB Thursday, January 25, 2018. During the next meeting members will be asked to review and evaluate the proposed options that were compiled and incorporated into an Options Evaluation Worksheet, and will subsequently be posted to the BCIS a minimum of seven days prior to the Workgroup's next meeting. Following discussion and refinement of options, members may be asked to do additional rankings of proposed options if requested by a Workgroup member. Members should be prepared to offer specific refinements to address their reservations. Once ranked, options with a 75% or greater number of 4's and 3's in proportion to 2's and 1's shall be considered consensus recommendations. The Workgroup's consensus recommendations will be submitted to the Commission for consideration pursuant to the Project Workplan (See Attachment 3).
