As the largest building department in Miami-Dade County encompassing the County's unincorporated areas, parking lot maintenance, repair and alteration are an expanding source of permit applications. As older pre-1997 parking lots are renovated, the Building and Neighborhood Compliance Department plan review staff must review and determine if the permit application will trigger the requirement to install compliant accessible parking, ramps, etc.

Please accept for consideration this petition for a Declaratory Statement regarding the applicability of Section 11-4.1.6 of the 2007 edition of the Florida Building Code, Building to work contemplated at a shopping center parking lot.

Issue:

The project in question is an existing public accommodation building permitted and constructed prior to October 1, 1997, with a parking lot which was constructed without accessible parking spaces. The proposed application is to maintain the parking lot by repainting the parking lot lines in the location where they currently exist.

Question #1:

Is the repainting over existing parking space lines without altering their location considered an alteration, as defined in the Florida Building Code section 11-3, which would affect the usability of the lot and trigger the installation of accessible parking spaces in the above described parking lot?

Question #2

Is the resurfacing, sealcoating or slurry-sealing of an existing parking lot considered an alteration which would affect the usability of the lot and trigger the installation of accessible parking spaces the above described parking lot?
