# **MEETING FACILITATION:**

# **Declaratory Statement:**

# A) DS 2024-002 by Shabe Kittendorf of City of Cape Coral

## Staff:

Mr. Madani provided the background information on the declaratory statement, along with questions and full analysis.

## **Questions/Staff Answers:**

## **Question #1:**

When reviewing the minimum plan review criteria for Residential (one- and two-family) projects under section 107.3.5, is the inclusion of the electrical, plumbing, mechanical and gas drawings required to be a part of the submittal package?

#### **Answer:**

The answer to the Petitioner's question is yes. Pursuant to sections R101.1, M1301.1, G2401.1, P2601.1 and E3401.1, Florida Building Code (FBC), Residential, 8th Edition (2023), one-and two-family projects are required to comply with the electrical, plumbing, mechanical and gas requirements of the FBC, as applicable. Section 107.3.5, Florida Building Code, Building, 8th Edition (2023) provides for a minimum list of items that need to be submitted/outlined in the submittal package. However, the Building Official has the authority to require additional

information necessary to substantiate compliance with the applicable requirements of the FBC. Further, pursuant to section 107.2.1, Florida Building Code, Building, 8th Edition (2023), it is the responsibility of the Building Official to determine that a construction document submittal provides sufficient information and details necessary to show compliance with the electrical, plumbing, mechanical and gas requirements of the Florida Building Code, Residential, 8th Edition (2023).

## **Question #2:**

When reviewing the minimum plan review criteria for Residential (one- and two-family) projects under section 107.3.5, is the inclusion of the electrical, plumbing, mechanical and gas minimum plan review criteria required to be enforced?

# **Question #3:**

When reviewing the minimum plan review criteria under section 107.3.5, is the enforcement of the minimum plan review criteria for electrical, plumbing, mechanical and gas able to be omitted by the Building Official from plan review in association to Residential (one-and two-family) projects?

## B) DS 2024-010 by Tatiana Gust of Elite Permits

## **Question/Answer:**

Is the intent of the Florida Building Code section 107.3.4.1 to allow submittal of items within a specified period of time, whether reviewed and/or inspected by the local building department or reviewed and/or inspected by private providers? In other words, the same process shall be followed to process deferred submittal items within each jurisdiction regardless of if the permit application or permit involves a private provider. For example, if permits not involving private providers are allowed to submit deferred submittal items after permit issuance, then permits involving private providers shall also be allowed to submit deferral submittal items after permit issuance. I kindly request the Florida Building Commission to issue a declaratory statement on this matter, providing guidance on the correct interpretation and application of Florida Building Code 8th Edition Section 107.3.4.1 in conjunction with Florida Statutes 553.791 Section 16(a) in cases involving deferred submittals by Private Providers.
