Chairman Bourré welcomed Commissioners, staff, and members of the public to Orlando, Florida and the April 16, 2024, onsite plenary session of the Florida Building Commission.

Chairman Bourré stated the primary focus of the April meeting is to consider regular procedural issues, updates, briefings, petitions, and reports. Specific actions include conducting rule development workshops on Rule 61G20-1.001 – Florida Building Code Adopted.

Chairman Bourré stated that, as always, we will provide an opportunity for public comment on each of the Commission's substantive discussion topics. He advised that if anyone wanted to comment on a specific substantive Commission agenda item, that they please wait until the facilitator invites members of the public to speak at the appropriate times throughout the meeting. Chairman Bourré stated that public input is welcome but should be offered before there is a formal motion on the floor.

Roll Call:

Mr. Blair performed roll call for the Florida Building Commission. A quorum was determined with 16 members present at roll call.

Agenda Approval:

Commissioner Schilling entered a motion to approve the agenda for today's meeting as amended. Commissioner Schock seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with a vote of 16 to 0.

Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes and Facilitator Report for February 13, 2024:

Commissioner Schilling entered a motion to approve the minutes from February 13, 2024, as posted. Commissioner Brown seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with a vote of 16 to 0.

Mr. Alan Burke briefly introduced himself to the Commission and the public.
