12	Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) and subsection
13	(2) of section 553.79, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
14	553.79 Permits; applications; issuance; inspections
15	(1)(a) After the effective date of the Florida Building
16	Code adopted as herein provided, it <u>is</u> shall be unlawful for any
17	person, firm, corporation, or governmental entity to construct,
18	erect, alter, modify, repair, or demolish any building within
19	the this state without first obtaining a permit therefor from
20	the appropriate enforcing agency or from such persons as may, by
21	appropriate resolution or regulation of the authorized state or
22	local enforcing agency, be delegated authority to issue such
23	permits, upon the payment of such reasonable fees adopted by the
24	enforcing agency. The enforcing agency is empowered to revoke
25	any such permit upon a determination by the agency that the
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26 construction, erection, alteration, modification, repair, or 27 demolition of the building for which the permit was issued is in 28 violation of, or does not conform not in conformity with, the provisions of the Florida Building Code. If Whenever a permit 29 30 required under this section is denied or revoked because the plan, or the construction, erection, alteration, modification, 31 32 repair, or demolition of a building, is found by the local 33 enforcing agency to not comply be not in compliance with the 34 Florida Building Code, the local enforcing agency shall identify the specific plan or project features that do not comply with 35 36 the applicable codes, identify the specific code chapters and sections upon which the finding is based, and provide this 37 38 information to the permit applicant. A plans reviewer, local or 39 building code administrator or inspector, or firesafety marshal or inspector who is responsible for issuing a denial, 40 41 revocation, or modification request but fails to provide to the permit applicant a reason for denying, revoking, or requesting a 42 43 modification, based on compliance with the Florida Building 44 Code, the Florida Fire Prevention Code and the Life Safety Code, 45 or local ordinance, is subject to disciplinary action against 46 his or her license pursuant to s. 468.621(1)(i). Installation, 47 replacement, removal, or metering of any load management control 48 device is exempt from and is shall not be subject to the permit 49 process and fees otherwise required by this section. (2) (a) Except as provided in subsection (8), an enforcing 50

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51 agency may not issue any permit for construction, erection, 52 alteration, modification, repair, or demolition of any building 53 or structure until the local building code administrator or inspector has reviewed the plans and specifications required by 54 55 the Florida Building Code, or local amendment thereto, for such 56 proposal and found that the plans comply to be in compliance 57 with the Florida Building Code. If the local building code 58 administrator or inspector finds that the plans do not comply 59 are not in compliance with the Florida Building Code, the local building code administrator or inspector shall identify the 60 specific plan features that do not comply with the applicable 61 codes, identify the specific code chapters and sections upon 62 which the finding is based, and provide this information to the 63 64 local enforcing agency. The local enforcing agency shall provide 65 this information to the permit applicant.

66 (b) In addition, An enforcing agency may not issue any permit for construction, erection, alteration, modification, 67 68 repair, or demolition of any building or structure until the 69 appropriate firesafety marshal or inspector certified under 70 pursuant to s. 633.216 has reviewed the plans and specifications 71 required by the Florida Building Code, or local amendment 72 thereto, for such proposal and found that the plans comply with 73 the Florida Fire Prevention Code and the Life Safety Code. If a 74 firesafety marshal or inspector is required to approve the plans of a commercial building or structure, and such plans have 75

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76	already been approved and sealed by the local building
77	department, the local building code administrator or inspector
78	and the firesafety marshal or inspector do not have the
79	discretionary authority to change the plans. Any building or
80	structure <u>that</u> which is not subject to a firesafety code <u>is</u>
81	shall not be required to have its plans reviewed by the
82	firesafety <u>marshal or</u> inspector. <mark>If a firesafety marshal or</mark>
83	inspector is not required to approve the plans of a commercial
84	or residential building or structure, and such plans have
85	already been approved and sealed by the local building
86	department, the local building code administrator or inspector
87	does not have the discretionary authority to change the plans.
88	Any building or structure that is exempt from the local building
89	permit process may not be required to have its plans reviewed by
90	the local building code administrator or inspector.
91	(c) Industrial construction on sites where design,
92	construction, and firesafety are supervised by appropriate
93	design and inspection professionals and which contain adequate
94	in-house fire departments and rescue squads is exempt, subject
95	to local government option, from review of plans and
96	inspections, providing owners certify that applicable codes and
97	standards have been met and supply appropriate approved drawings
98	to local building code administrators or inspectors and
99	firesafety <u>marshals or</u> inspectors.
100	(d) The enforcing agency shall issue a permit to
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101 construct, erect, alter, modify, repair, or demolish any 102 building or structure when the plans and specifications for such 103 proposal comply with the Florida Building Code and the Florida 104 Fire Prevention Code and the Life Safety Code as determined by 105 the local authority in accordance with this chapter and chapter 106 633.

107 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

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
