Question related to the Special Occupancy glitch (HB 1175). I see the proposed statute change and the need to change the below from four to seven, but we did not make that change for the following: “or that provide surgical treatment requiring general anesthesia to **four** or more patients at the same time”. Doesn’t this also need to be changed to seven or am I reading that wrong?

469.3.1 *Office surgery suites that provide services or treatment on an outpatient basis to ~~four~~ seven or more patients at the same time that either renders the patients incapable of taking action for self-preservation under emergency conditions without the assistance from others or that provide surgical treatment requiring general anesthesia to **four or more** patients at the same time, shall meet the requirements of Ambulatory Health.*

Also, I assume if this proposed bill does not become law, this glitch will not move forward, correct?
